

**NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE
PROVINCIAL HERITAGE PROPERTY

TAKE NOTICE THAT not less than sixty (60) days from:

- a) the giving of the Notice of Intention to the owner of the affected property;
- b) the registering of an interest based on this Notice in the Land Titles Registry;
- c) the publishing of this Notice in a local newspaper;
- d) the publishing of this Notice in the *Saskatchewan Gazette*;

I intend to make an order that the property known as:

Regina Indian Industrial School Cemetery

and legally described as:

The portion of the lands within the area commencing at the most north-westerly corner below the City of Regina Right-of-Way Plan No. GA3458 and proceeding southerly 85 metres, then easterly 50 metres in perpendicular width throughout, then northerly to the Right-of-Way in perpendicular width throughout, then north-westerly to the point of commencement, situate on lands legally described as Surface Parcel #109553249, Reference Land Description: Blk/Par D, Plan 85R14545 Extension 0.

be designated as Provincial Heritage Property under sections 39 and 41 of *The Heritage Property Act*.

The reasons for the proposed designation are as follows:

1. The property's association with Canada's Indian Industrial School system in Saskatchewan and the lasting impact this approach to education had upon the attendees, their families and their communities.
2. The property's association with the approximately 43 different First Nations communities, mostly in Saskatchewan, whose children attended the Regina Indian Industrial School between 1891 and 1910.


