The Saskatchewan Heritage Foundation reviews grant applications twice each year. Application deadlines are January 15 and August 15.

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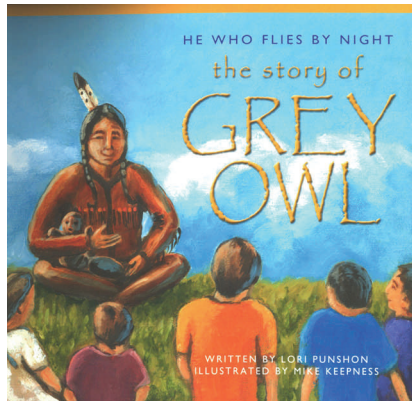
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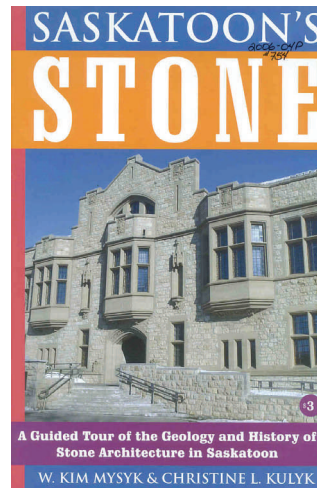

This program assists individuals and organizations in publishing new, well-documented material on the history, pre-history and heritage resources of Saskatchewan. Manuscripts should be original and present new knowledge and/or interpretation of some aspect of Saskatchewan's heritage.

- A) Manuscripts must reflect acceptable standards of research and writing in their documentation and presentation of the subject matter.
- B) Manuscripts will generally be targeted to a general rather than an academic audience, but significant publications intended for a technical audience will be considered, including research tools such as bibliographies, atlases and technical guides on specific types of research.

- F) All publications receiving assistance must include the following credit line:
“Financially assisted by the Saskatchewan Heritage Foundation.”

Ineligible:

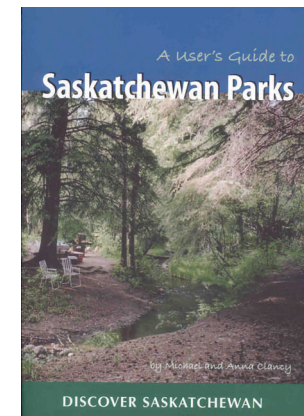
- C) Proposals will be evaluated according to their research interest and value, the quality of their composition and their potential market.
- D) A name/subject index at the end of the publications is required.
- E) Reprints will be considered only in exceptional circumstances.

- A) Community and family histories, genealogical studies and annual reports.
- B) Distributing, marketing and warehousing costs.
- C) Magazine articles, although exceptions may be considered.

Application Requirements:

Provision of information in the following categories is essential for the Heritage Foundation Board to gain an appreciation of the purpose, scope and merit of the proposal.

1. Applicants must provide a (printed) copy of a draft manuscript. Please note that this must be a final, edited version of the manuscript, from which all factual and typographical errors have been eliminated.
2. A resumé of the writer(s)/researcher(s) must be submitted.
3. Any funding support in addition to the applicant’s own resources will increase the likelihood of funding through the Heritage Foundation.
4. Letters of support and endorsement should be attached whenever possible.
5. An estimate, if possible, of projected sales revenues, together with a marketing plan.
6. A brief description of the manuscript’s content, its significance to Saskatchewan’s heritage and an outline of the sources consulted in preparing it.
