The Saskatchewan Heritage Foundation reviews grant applications twice each year. Application deadlines are January 15 and August 15.

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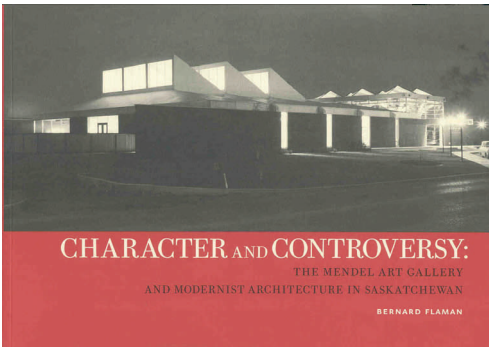
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To develop innovative ways of addressing key issues in heritage conservation in Saskatchewan, the Heritage Foundation is interested in supporting and working in partnership in projects that develop or experiment with new approaches, ideas or techniques. This program will enable the Foundation, in concert with other agencies, non-profit organizations and individuals to adopt a proactive position on important issues relating to both the cultural and natural heritage of the province.

The Foundation is interested in projects that link initiatives resulting in benefits to a wide range of stakeholders. These initiatives may be directed at features of ecological, historical, archaeological, architectural or cultural interest, may deal with provincial, regional or community-based themes and may have inter-jurisdictional implications.

While this program encourages innovative projects, **all proposals must have a clear and identifiable heritage component**, as defined by the Foundation, relating to some aspect of Saskatchewan’s history or pre-history.

- As this program encourages projects that may not fit the requirements of standard granting programs, there are no specific guidelines. However, proposals should be consistent with the general guidelines.

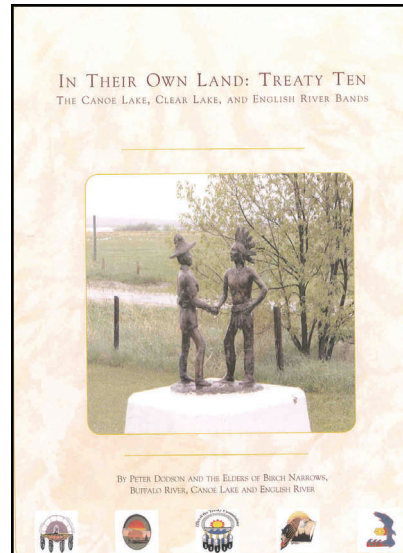
Application Requirements:

The following information must be provided.

1. *Project Description:* Briefly describe the nature of the proposed project, including appropriate details.
2. *Project Significance and Community Benefits:* Indicate why this project is important. Also, indicate any significant local economic benefits for tourism development, community-based business improvement, economic diversification or social benefits which may result from this project.

3. *Project Budget and Schedule:* Indicate when the project will be undertaken, by whom, and what specific costs are projected.

As well, a statement is required of financial contributions from the applicant and other agencies, such as municipalities, universities, other government departments, societies, etc.
